

Archaeology Mentoring Program Guidelines

(Nunavut Beneficiaries Only)

The Archaeology Mentoring Program was created to assist Inuit students in training opportunities who may wish to choose Archaeology as a profession.

The Inuit Heritage Trust wishes to encourage Inuit high school students to enter into Archaeology as an opportunity to be involved in this field.

The scholarship will be awarded to students attending high schools within Nunavut. The Mentoring Program can support for up to four (4) students each year @ \$6000.00 per student. Archaeologists are expected to cover the students food costs while in camp, as well provide training and an evaluation of the student performance.

In addition, (there may be other academic requirements imposed by the selected students school, in case they are receiving High School Credits), students are expected to submit a short report of their experience to the Inuit Heritage Trust.

The following guidelines will be for the qualification, acceptance and awarding of the funds for the Mentoring program:

- The Mentorship fund will be open to any Nunavut beneficiary that is pursuing high school education within Nunavut.
- Prior involvement in Heritage-related activities is not a pre-requisite for the scholarship but will strengthen your application.
- Applicants must submit a completed application form, including a cover letter providing details why you should be considered to be a recipient, describing what you might contribute to the area of Archaeology in Nunavut and what benefit/effect this scholarship will have.
- Should you be chosen to be a recipient, applicants will be required to attend an interview in person or by telephone at the cost of IHT.

- Applicants may reapply in following years, providing simple guidelines of how the monies will be spent within one (1) year of the award date and provide a detailed report on the use of the funds.
- An application form and these guidelines will be available to individuals on the IHT website at: www.ihti.ca.
- The time line for the applications:
 - April 31st; Application deadline. Any application received after that date will not be considered.
 - June 1st; Announcement and awarding of funding.

The judging panel will be made up of:

- IHT Board Member (up to two) members
- IHT Staff (up to two) staff
