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1. Announcements

A. Alianait Selection Comittee

The organizers of the Alianait Arts Festival (June 21 – July 1, 2009) announce an open call for members of the 2009 Alianait Selection Committee.

The Alianait Arts Festival is looking for individuals who would like to participate in the 2009 Alianait Selection Committee. The task of this committee is to select the musical performers for the fifth annual Alianait Arts Festival.

Each year, application forms for potential performers are uploaded onto our website and distributed widely. Any artist who wishes to perform at the festival must complete this application form and send it to Selection Committee, along with support material, including musical samples. Members of the Selection Committee are required to go through the applications, listen to all of the musical samples and, based on a set of criteria, come to a thoughtful decision regarding the line-up of 2009 Alianait.

To be a Member of the Selection Committee:

- You do not necessarily need to be a musician but must have a deep appreciation of music and a wide range of musical tastes.
- You will need an adequate amount of time to listen to the music of all of the applicants. We ask for three songs from each applicant and last year there were approximately 60 applicants. We anticipate an even greater number this year.
- ➤ You will need to attend approximately three (3) meetings with the other members of the Selection Committee. The approximate dates of the meetings are: December 16, 2008, January 9, 2009 and January 14, 2009. Final recommendations must be made by January 15, 2009.

C. National Archival Development Program (NADP)

The Canadian Council of Archives has recently released its forms and guidelines for the National Archival Development Program (NADP) for the upcoming fiscal year 2009/2010. The NADP guidelines, application form, and other information can be found on and downloaded from the CCA website at

http://www.cdncouncilarchives.ca/NADP.html under the heading "Apply For NADP 2009-2010 Funding", sub-heading "For Applicants". I have also attached below the PDF

format files for the NAPD Guidelines and Criteria, and the NADP Application form (in PDF and Word files) - all found on the CCA site page previously mentioned.

Deadlines for NADP 2009/2010 funding are as follows:

-Applications must be received by the Archives Council of Nunavut by mail or fax by 5:00 PM EST, December 15, 2008

- -The ACN adjudication committee will review all applications for submission to the CCA by January 30, 2009
- -CCA will notify the ACN about its decisions on NADP applications by April 10, 2009

For NADP 2009/2010 a total of \$40,000 in funding is being offered to Nunavut. This year's adjudication committee will work with all Nunavut NADP applicants to submit complete and eligible applications.

Please note You must be a current, 2008/09, member of the Archives Council of Nunavut to apply for NADP funding. ACN memberships can be applied for now. Please ask if you need a membership application form or more information on ACN memberships.

Also, listed below, please look at the descriptions for Nunavut's strategic priority objectives for 2009-2010 NADP applications - Objectives 3 and 4. These objectives relate directly to the areas of funding eligible through the National Archival Development Program. Any NADP application you submit should focus on one of these two objectives.
